YOUR VOTE - YOUR VOICE

Every day millions of American children recite the Pledge of Allegiance in schools all across our country, committing us to a nation with "liberty and Justice for all". On Tuesday, August 26, 2014, Leon County's adult citizens will be provided with the opportunity to make that pledge real, by voting for the people you think are best suited to lead our community, our state, and our country.

After the failure of the last election to accommodate the voters – the wait time for most Florida voters was 45 minutes (last in the nation) - the Florida Legislature was forced to rescind the laws passed in 2011, restoring the two week early voting period and once again giving local election officials the flexibility to ensure all our voters can be accommodated without long waits

Locally, we have made additional changes to the voting process, adding two new early voting sites for your convenience, as well as buying new optical scan voting machines to replace the system we've had for the past 20 years. For the first time all voters, regardless of ability, can cast their ballots on the same voting machine, insuring voter equality. These changes will be addressed in detail in your Election Guide, so I hope you take the time to study it, and if you have any questions please call us so we may address your issue.

Finally, the Primary Election will determine who will be our next Leon County School Board District 1 member; who will be the Tallahassee City Commissioner for Seat 3; and who will be the next state representative for Florida House of Representatives in District 9. These races will not go to the November General Election, and are open to all voters residing in the proper Districts regardless of party registration. For these races the Primary is the General Election so don't make the mistake of waiting until the November election to make your votes count.

3Ways to 🛧 Absentee **Early Voting** At your Precinct



ABSENTEE / MAIL BALLOTS provide you the opportunity to vote in the privacy of your home or office. You may request an Absentee Ballot for all elections or a single election. All voted Absentee Ballots must be returned to the Elections Office prior to 7 p.m. on Election Day.

EARLY VOTING It's easy to vote at any one of our early voting locations across Leon County. All sites are open Saturday, August 16th through Saturday, August 23rd, with times varying by location. 

Free Parking Downtown

arking Once again, the Leon County Board of County Commissioners has approved the first hour free for parking downtown at one of two parking garages to ease the parking shortage for downtown early voting. Two parking garages issue a yellow ticket and are operated by Republic. The two garages are operated by Republic and are: Kleman Plaza, 306 S. Duval Street, and the garage located at the southeast corner of College Avenue and Calhoun Street, 215 S. Calhoun Street. ADA accessible parking is provided along Calhoun Street with the public entrance to the Courthouse open during voting hours for ease of access. Affix your "I VOTED" sticker to your yellow parking ticket and the first hour is paid for by the Leon County Board of County Commissioners.

Election Day – Last chance to vote is at your assigned polling Precinct or return your Absentee Ballot at the Leon County Courthouse 7 am – 7 pm.

Early Voting is available to all eligible Leon County Voters at any of the seven Early Voting Locations. Also, Absentee Ballots may be picked up or dropped off at any of our Early Voting sites.

A current valid picture and signature ID is required to vote.

DEADLINES

The deadline to request an Absentee Ballot is 5:30 pm, Wednesday, August 20, 2014. This may be done in person, by mail, by telephone (850) 606-8683 or online at our website: www.LeonVotes.org. Voted Absentee Ballots may only be accepted at a precinct **IF** you, the voter, are surrendering it to vote at your precinct.

Mail your ballot in time to be received by our office no later than 7:00 pm on Election Day, August 26th, 2014.

If you think there is not enough time for the US Postal Service to route your ballot to us, it can be hand-delivered directly to our office by you or someone you choose. Ballots **received** after 7:00 p.m. on August 26th, 2014 will not count in this election.



- 2. Place your ballot, one page at a time, into the voting machine.



- 3. Wait for the screen to accept your ballot.
- 4. Return the privacy folder to the Machine Inspector and exit the voting area.

Voting Using an Accessible Voting Session

Insert Your Ballot

1. Provide the Accessible Audit Ticket to the Machine Inspector, who will customize your voting session to your needs.



2. Insert your blank ballot into the machine to begin your Accessible Voting Session.

Use the Controller or Your Device

Use the controller, or plug your sip/puff or paddleboard device into the 3.5mm port on the controller to



navigate through your voting session.


Follow the Instructions

Customize your voting session using the navigation instructions to:

- 1. Increase/Decrease the audio's volume.
- 2. Change the rate of the audio's speed.
- 3. Change the ballot zoom.
- 4. Change the contrast level.

4 Select Candidates

Using the controller, or your device, make your selections as you move through the races on your ballot.



Your choices will be displayed or spoken as you make them. You can always make changes as needed.



Review Your Ballot

Before casting your ballot you are given the option to review your selections and make final changes before casting your votes.





Once satisfied with your selections, you will instruct the voting machine to mark your ballot and cast it for you.



Your vote has counted and you may now exit the voting area.

BRING YOUR PHOTO ID WITH YOU WHEN YOU VOTE

If the picture ID does not contain the signature of the voter, an additional ID that provides the voter's signature shall be required. Voters at precincts without proper ID will be required to vote a Provisional Ballot.



PROVISIONAL BALLOTS

A provisional ballot is a time-saving tool for the voter when their eligibility to vote is uncertain. It allows the Supervisor of Elections Office to research the matter and present any evidence to Leon County's Canvassing Board.

Anyone who votes a provisional ballot has until 5 pm on the second day following the Election to present evidence of their eligibility.



The Canvassing Board decides if the provisional ballot will be counted when it meets on the third day following the Election. **Most provisional ballots are counted.**

Provisional ballots are often issued when:

- Voter requested an Absentee Ballot and did not bring it to the polls to surrender.
- · Voter did not provide valid picture and signature identification.
- Voter's name was not found in the voter records on Election Day.
- Voter has not changed their previous Florida county address prior to Election Day.

Provisional ballots are often not counted when:

- Voter votes in the wrong precinct on Election Day.
- Voter has not registered 29 days before the Election.

VOTER'S BILL OF RIGHTS

Each registered voter in this state has the right to:

- 1. Vote and have her or his vote accurately counted.
- 2. Cast a vote if he or she is in line at the official closing of the polls in that county.
- 3. Ask for and receive assistance in voting.
- 4. Receive up to two replacement ballots if he or she makes a mistake prior to the ballot being cast.
- 5. An explanation if her or his registration or identity is in question.
- 6. If his or her registration or identity is in question, cast a provisional ballot.
- 7. Written instructions to use when voting, and, upon request, oral instructions in voting from Elections Officers.
- 8. Vote free from coercion or intimidation by Elections Officers or any other person.
- 9. Vote on a voting system that is in working condition and that will allow votes to be accurately cast.



VOTER RESPONSIBILITIES

Each registered voter in this state should:

- 1. Familiarize herself or himself with the candidates and issues.
- 2. Maintain with the office of the Supervisor of Elections a current address.
- 3. Know the location of her or his polling place and its hours of operation.
- 4. Bring proper identification to the polling station.
- 5. Familiarize herself or himself with the operation of the voting equipment in his or her precinct.
- 6. Treat precinct workers with courtesy.
- 7. Respect the privacy of other voters.
- 8. Report any problems or violations of Election laws to the Supervisor of Elections.
- 9. Ask questions, if needed.
- 10. Make sure that her or his completed ballot is correct before leaving the polling station.
