Leon County Supervisor of Elections Mails Ballots for the 2019 Special Election

Leon County, FL – Today, just over 800 Vote-by-Mail ballots were mailed to Leon County voters, kicking off the 2019 Florida House of Representatives District 7 Special Election. Vote-by-Mail ballots were also mailed to overseas voters and members of the armed forces who are serving outside of Leon County. Voters should expect delivery of their Vote-by-Mail ballot over the next few days.

All registered Leon County voters that reside in House District 7 may vote in the June 18th Special Election, where voters will select between the Democratic and Republican party nominees for the House District 7 seat. In Leon County, only registered voters that reside in precincts 2251, 2253, 2358, 2365 & 2366 are affected.

Important Special Election dates:

- Voter Registration Deadline – Monday, May 20th
- Early Voting – Saturday, June 8 – Saturday, June 15
- Deadline to request a Vote-by-Mail ballot - Wednesday, June 12th.

Voters are reminded that their ballot must be returned to the Leon County Supervisor of Elections office by 7 p.m. on June 18th for the ballot to count. Voters should allow up to five calendar days for return delivery of their ballot.
