**Leon County Supervisor of Elections Mails Ballots for the Special Primary Election**

**Leon County, FL** – On Tuesday, March 5<sup>th</sup>, 296 Vote-by-Mail ballots were mailed to Leon County voters, kicking off the Special Primary Election for the Republican Party. Vote-By-Mail ballots were also mailed to overseas voters and members of the armed forces who are serving outside of Leon County and are eligible to vote in the Special Primary Election to be held on April 9, 2019.

Voters that reside in precincts 2251, 2253, 2358, 2365 and 2366 should expect delivery of their Vote-by-Mail ballot over the next few days. Voters are reminded that their ballot must be returned to the Leon County Supervisor of Elections office by 7 p.m. on April 9<sup>th</sup> for the ballot to count. Voters should allow up to five calendar days for return delivery of their ballot.

The deadline to request a Vote-by-Mail ballot for the Special Primary Election is Wednesday, April 3<sup>rd</sup>.
