**Official Election Guides Mailed for the Republican House District 7
Special Primary Election**

Leon County, FL – With just over 2,000 registered voters eligible to vote in April 9th Special Primary Election to choose the Republican Party nominee for the Florida House District 7 contest, direct mail is the best means by which to educate voters on what they need to know before they head to the polls. Over the next week, voters can expect to find an essential resource in their mailbox.

The Official Election Guide includes a generic sample ballot, the list of Early Voting sites, the list of Election Day polling locations, ID requirements for voting, Vote-by-Mail information, and more. Voters may also request resources in Spanish in person, by phone, or on LeonVotes.org/es.

Florida is a closed primary state, so you must be registered as a Republican voter and live in one of the 5 precincts in Leon County (2251, 2253, 2358, 2365 and 2366) that fall within Florida House District 7 to vote in this special primary election.

NOTE: All voters living in House District 7 can vote in the Special Election on June 18th, where voters will select between the Democrat and Republican nominees for the House 7 seat.

As always, you have “3 Ways to Vote” in Leon County:

1. Request a **Vote-by-Mail** ballot by April 3rd. Call or visit us in person or on the web.
2. Vote at one of Leon County’s 3 **Early Voting** sites from March 30th – April 6th.
3. Vote on **Election Day**, April 9th at one of Leon County’s 4 polling locations.
