Special Primary Election for the Republican Party to be held Tuesday, April 9, 2019

Leon County, FL – Since multiple Republican candidates have qualified for the Florida House District 7 Special Election, there will be a Special Primary Election for the Republican Party on April 9, 2019.

Only voters that reside in House District 7 and are registered Republican by the registration deadline may vote in the April 9 Special Primary Election. In Leon County, precincts **2251, 2253, 2358, 2365, and 2366** are the only precincts in House District 7.

Voters have several options for verifying their eligibility to vote:

- Visit LeonVotes.org and click the Your Voter Info button to look up your voting information online. Your eligibility is listed under the “Future Elections” section.
- Check your Voter Information Card for the 4-digit precinct number listed under your name and address on the front of the card. Your political party affiliation is listed to the right of your name and address.
- Call the Leon County Supervisor of Elections office at (850) 606-8683 for help.

Important upcoming dates:

- Register to vote or update political party affiliation by March 11
- Vote-by-Mail – request ballot by April 5. Due to the Supervisor by 7 p.m. April 9
- Early Voting – Saturday, March 30 – Saturday, April 6
- Election Day at assigned polling locations – April 9 polls open 7 a.m. – 7p.m.

As always, eligible voters have three ways to vote: Vote-by-Mail, Early Voting, and on Election Day at their assigned precinct. Also, we will mail an Official Special Primary Election Guide, including a sample ballot, to affected Leon County voters.
