# A message from your Supervisor of Elections

Dear Leon County Voter,

With much anticipation, the 2018 General Election is finally upon us.

This is a very important election with implications for Federal, State, and Local governments. In addition to the many office contests, there are twelve proposed amendments to the Florida Constitution as well as local charter questions for Leon County and the City of Tallahassee.

If you care about your neighborhood, if you want a say in choices that impact your daily life, then you owe it to yourself and those you hold dear to take part in our democracy and vote.

That's why we provide this Election Guide--to help you vote in Leon County. Use it to learn about your rights, responsibilities, and voting options so you can cast an informed ballot.

Here are some tips to make voting FAST, SMOOTH, and EASY:

- **Study the ballot before you vote.** This is an exceptionally long ballot for a midterm election. If you wait until you are in the voting booth to read the ballot, it will take you a long time to make your choices. This leads to lines on Election Day.
- **Know your choices before you go to vote.** A Sample Ballot is included in the center of this guide to help you prepare and do your research in advance.
- **Take a "cheat sheet" to the polls.** I encourage you to use the Sample Ballot in the center of this guide for this purpose. Bring your list of choices with you to the polls so you can more quickly vote your ballot. Just don't leave it in the voting booth for the next voter to see.
- **Take advantage of Vote-By-Mail or Early Voting opportunities.** In this guide are details on how to request a Vote-By-Mail ballot, as well as information about Early Voting locations and times.
- **Verify and, if needed, update your voter information with our office.** It is very important that we have your current residence address and current signature to make sure you are voting on the right races and that your ballot can be counted. Visit [LeonVotes.org/Update](http://LeonVotes.org/Update) for online resources that may be helpful to you.

For your convenience, there will be a new Early Voting site at the FSU Tucker Center (aka Civic Center) that should improve voting opportunities for our students and ease difficulties while construction continues around the Leon County Courthouse. The Courthouse Early Voting site will, of course, still be open.

# HOW TO VOTE

## **VOTE** 3 Ways to ★ Vote by Mail ★ Early Voting ★ At Your Precinct



Request a **Vote By Mail** ballot for a single election or for all elections through 2020. The Supervisor of Elections office must receive your mail ballot by 7:00 pm on Election Day, November 6, 2018.



**Early Voting** makes voting in person easy and convenient! Our 9 Early Voting sites are open Monday, October 22, through Sunday, November 4. Times vary by location (see “Early Voting” in this guide or visit [LeonVotes.org/EarlyVoting](http://LeonVotes.org/EarlyVoting)).



**Election Day** is your *last chance to vote!* Election Day voting hours are 7:00 am to 7:00 pm on Tuesday, November 6, 2018, at your assigned polling location. To verify your voter information before you vote, visit [LeonVotes.org](http://LeonVotes.org) (click “Your Voter Info”) or call us at (850)606-8683.

## VOTER’S BILL OF RIGHTS

**Each registered voter in this state has the right to:**

- Vote and have her or his vote accurately counted.
- Cast a vote if he or she is in line at the official closing of the polls in that county.
- Ask for and receive assistance in voting.
- Receive up to two replacement ballots if he or she makes a mistake prior to the ballot being cast.
- An explanation if her or his registration or identity is in question.
- If his or her registration or identity is in question, cast a Provisional Ballot.
- Written instructions to use when voting, and, upon request, oral instructions in voting from Elections Officers.
- Vote free from coercion or intimidation by Elections Officers or any other person.
- Vote on a voting system that is in working condition and that will allow votes to be accurately cast.

## VOTER RESPONSIBILITIES

**Each registered voter in this state should:**

- Familiarize herself or himself with the candidates and issues.
- Maintain a current address with the Supervisor of Elections.
- Know the location of her or his polling place and its hours of operation.
- Bring proper identification to the polling station.
- Familiarize herself or himself with the operation of the voting equipment in his or her precinct.
- Treat precinct workers with courtesy.
- Respect the privacy of other voters.
- Report any problems or violations of election laws to the Supervisor of Elections.
- Ask questions, if needed.
- Make sure that her or his completed ballot is correct before leaving the polling station.

**VOTER'S CERTIFICATE: YOU MUST SIGN THIS OATH.**

I, \_\_\_\_\_ (PLEASE PRINT FULL NAME), do solemnly swear or affirm that I am a qualified and registered voter of Leon County, Florida, and that I have not and will not vote more than one ballot in this election. I understand that if I commit or attempt to commit any fraud in connection with voting, vote a fraudulent ballot, or vote more than once in an election, I can be convicted of a felony of the third degree and fined up to \$5,000, and/or imprisoned for up to 5 years. I also understand that failure to sign this certificate will invalidate my ballot.

**Ballot must be received by the Supervisor of Elections no later than 7:00 pm on Election Day.**

**Don't forget to sign your Vote By Mail Ballot Certificate!** However, if you forget to sign, you must complete an Unsigned Ballot Affidavit by Monday, November 5, 2018, to have your vote counted. You cannot sign for someone else.

The deadline to request a Vote By Mail ballot for the General Election is October 31, 2018. **The Supervisor of Elections Office must receive your ballot by 7:00 pm on Election Day, Tuesday, November 6, 2018 for your vote to count. Vote By Mail Ballots are NOT accepted at polling locations on Election Day.**

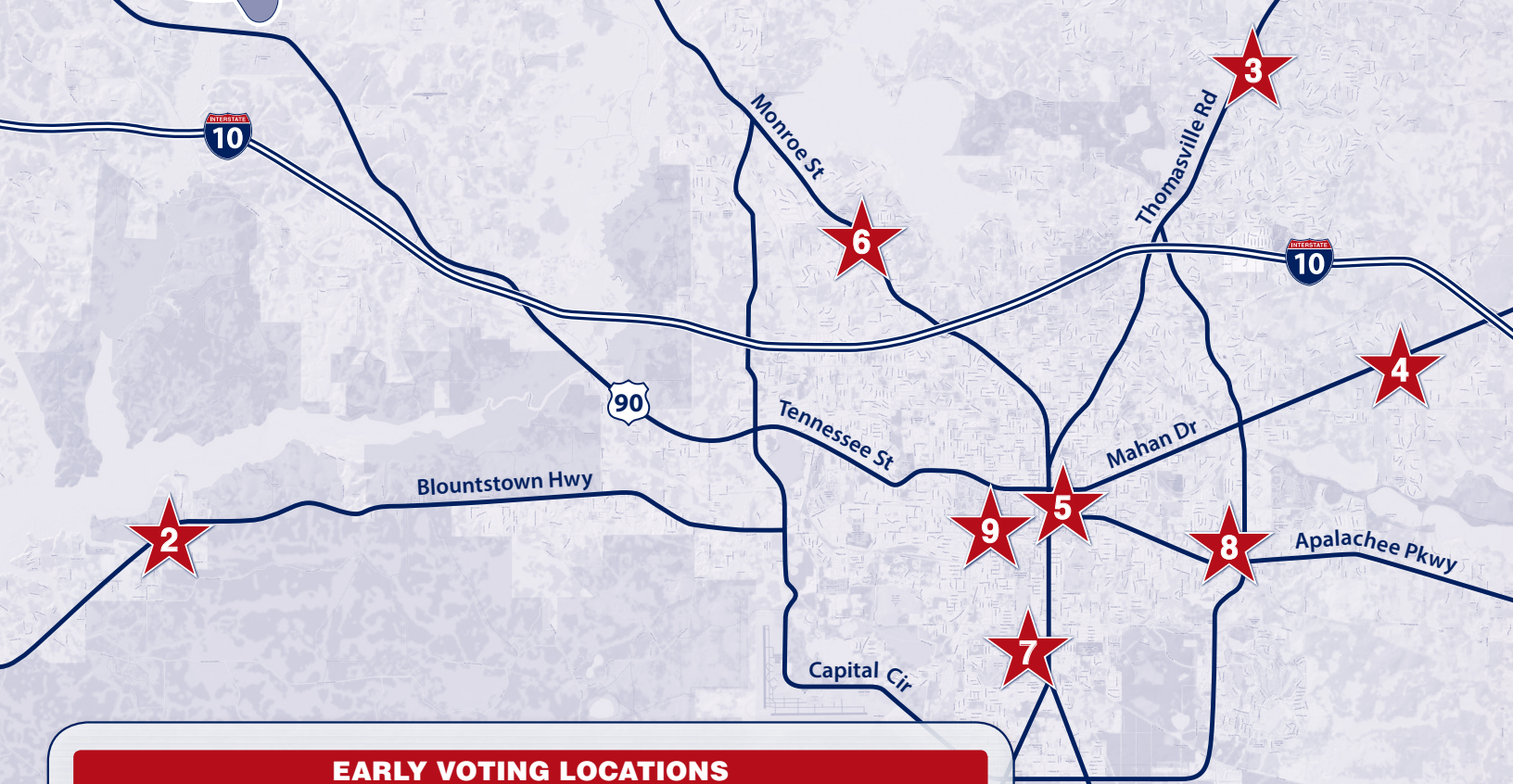

# ELECTION DAY

***November 6, 2018 is Election Day —  
Your last chance to vote!***



If you choose to vote on Election Day, you must cast a ballot at your assigned polling location. Your polling location is based on your precinct (where you live), which is listed on your Voter Information Card. Look up your polling location at the end of this guide or online at [LeonVotes.org](http://LeonVotes.org).

**Polls are open 7:00 am to 7:00 pm.**

*Did you know? The Voting Accessibility for the Elderly and Handicapped Act allows a voter who is over the age of 70 or physically disabled to move to the front of the line to vote!*

## ***Try Online Voter Registration (OVR)!***

Online Voter Registration (OVR) is available in Florida to register to vote or update your registration. OVR requires a Florida Driver's License or a Florida Identification Card. To access this resource, go to [LeonVotes.org/OVR](http://LeonVotes.org/OVR).

### Online Voter Registration (OVR)

As of October 1st, 2017, The State of Florida has provided another option for Voter Registration and updates to existing records. Over 30 states in the U.S. now offer this method of Voter Registration.



#### **Online Voter Registration (OVR) is designed to:**

- Verify Credentials (i.e. eligibility, Driver's License/State ID, Social Security Number and issue Date)
- Obtain the most recent signature from the Department of Highway Safety and Motor Vehicles

*New voter registration applications must be completed and submitted by October 9, 2018 to be effective for the November Election. In Florida, General Elections are open to voters registered in all political party affiliations.*

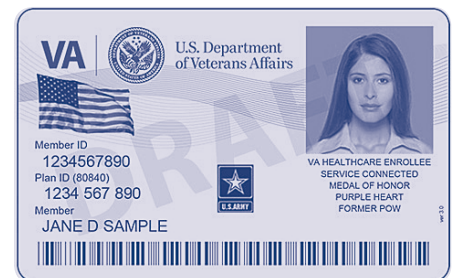

In-person voting in Florida requires a valid ID containing a photo and signature. The photo and signature can come from a single ID or a combination of IDs from the following list:

- FL Driver's License
- FL Identification Card
- US Passport
- Debit or Credit Card
- Military ID
- Student ID
- Retirement Center ID
- Neighborhood Association ID
- Public Assistance ID
- Veteran Health ID issued by the US Department of Veterans Affairs
- A Concealed Weapon/Firearm License issued pursuant §790.06, F.S.
- Employee ID issued by any branch, department, agency, or entity of the Federal Government, the State, a county, or a municipality.



**Your Voter Information Card does not count as valid ID to vote.**

## WHAT IF I DON'T HAVE ID?

If you do not show proper ID at the polls, you will be required to vote a Provisional Ballot. A Provisional Ballot is used when a voter's eligibility is uncertain. It allows the Supervisor of Elections office to count the voter's ballot after the office determines that the voter is eligible. Voters may track the status of their Provisional Ballot at [LeonVotes.org](http://LeonVotes.org) or by calling our office at (850) 606-8683.

Some Provisional Ballot voters may be required to submit additional eligibility documentation to the Supervisor of Elections office by 5:00 pm Thursday, November 8, 2018 for their ballot to be counted.

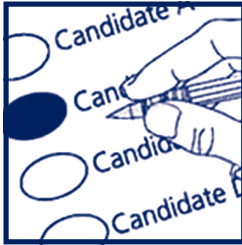


# CASTING YOUR BALLOT

Ensure your vote is counted by following three simple steps.

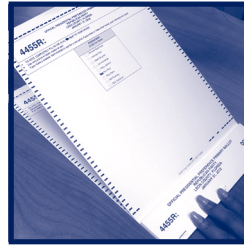
## 1. Fill in your ballot

To vote, fill in the oval completely next to your choice. You cannot vote for more than one choice in any race. If you make a mistake, ask for a new ballot or your vote may not count.



## 2. Review your ballot

If you wish to change or correct your vote, let a Poll Worker



know so you may be issued a new ballot. You are allowed up to three attempts to properly mark your ballot.

## 3. Cast your ballot

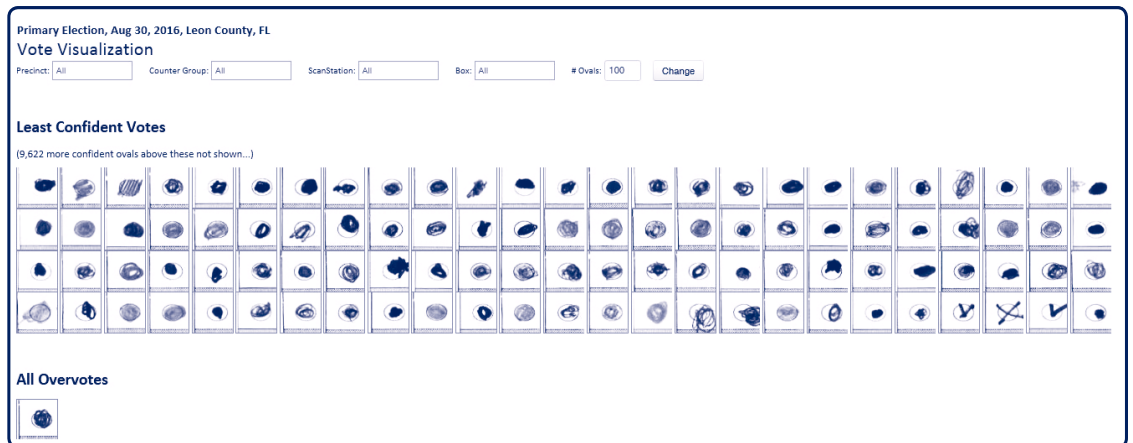
Place your ballot into the voting machine, wait for the machine to



accept your ballot, and then return the privacy folder to the Machine Inspector. Exit the voting area.

# BALLOT AUDIT SYSTEM — TRUST YET VERIFY

Leon County is one of the few counties in Florida that conducts a 100% audit on each ballot after every election. This audit system, launched in 2014, is completely independent from the voting system. The results of the two systems are compared for discrepancies after each election in a publicly held meeting. Your responsibility is to vote; ours is to verify that your voting system continues to count your votes accurately.





# ACCESSIBLE VOTING

**1. Tell a Poll Worker** that you want to vote using the accessible interface. They will give you an Accessible Audit Ticket and a ballot.

**2. The Machine Inspector** will customize your voting session to fit your needs. Then, insert your blank ballot into the machine to begin your Accessible Voting Session.

**3. Use the controller or your own accessible device** to navigate through your voting session.

**4. Follow the instructions** to further customize your voting session. Using the controller or your device, you can change the audio volume, the rate of audio speed, the ballot magnification, or the contrast level.

**5. Select candidates** using the controller or your device, make your selections as you move through the contests on the ballot. You will be able to see and/or hear your selections as you progress. You can always go back and make changes as needed.

**6. Review your ballot.** When you finish voting, you have the option to review your selections and make final changes before casting your ballot.

**7. Print and cast your ballot.** Once you are satisfied with your selections, you will instruct the voting machine to mark your ballot choices and cast it for you. Your vote has been counted and you may now exit the voting area.



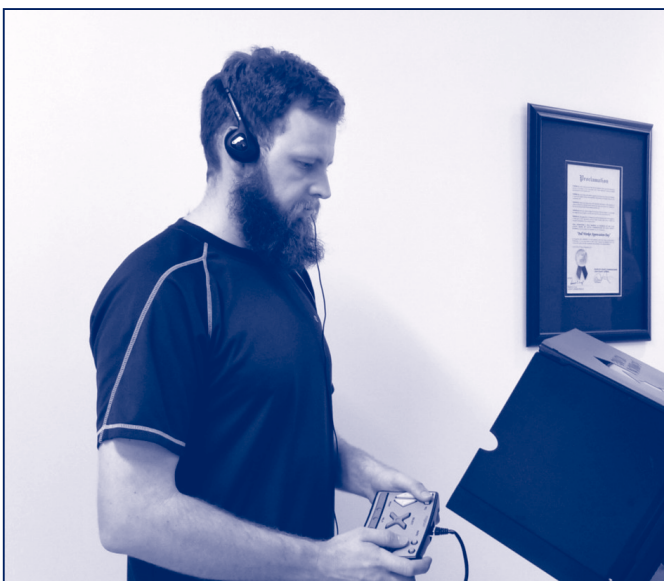

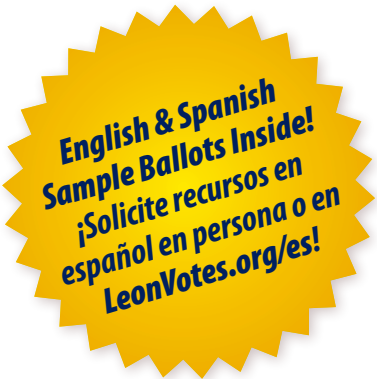
