Machine recount for Tallahassee City Commission Seat 3

Pending machine recount on State-wide contests

This is the public notice for a machine recount for Tallahassee City Commission Seat 3 and for potential State-wide contests that will be declared by the Florida Secretary of State no later than 2:00 Saturday, November 10th for the 2018 General Election. All recounts and meetings will be held concurrently throughout the recount process. Our office will be closed for Veteran's Day Monday, November 12th, but the recount will continue and all meetings are open to the public. Please use the Event Entrance on the south side of the building to enter the public area.

Event: Recount for any races declared
Time: Begins at 2:00 p.m. Saturday November 10th, 2018
Location: Leon County Election Center, 2990-1 Apalachee Parkway

The recount schedule will be posted at LeonVotes.org and is as follows:

- Saturday November 10th, 2:00 p.m.-8:00 p.m.
- Sunday November 11th, 8:00 a.m.-4:00 p.m. (if necessary)
- Monday November 12th, 8:00 a.m.-4:00 p.m. (if necessary)
- Tuesday November 13th, 8:00 a.m.-4:00 p.m. (if necessary)
- Wednesday November 14th, 10:00 a.m.-2:00 p.m. (if necessary)

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The recount and Canvassing Board meetings are open to the public. If you are an interested party or candidate, we encourage you to be familiar with the protocol for designating representatives to engage with the Canvassing Board. Names of representative may be emailed to Chris Moore, Deputy Supervisor of Elections or by submitting them in writing at the meeting in person.

(Excerpt from Recount Procedures)

(3)(d) Permissible representatives. The following persons or entities are entitled to have representatives present during a recount:

1. In a race, each candidate whose ultimate success or failure in the race could be adversely or favorably impacted by the recount is entitled to have:

- a. One representative for the county canvassing board.
- b. One additional representative per counting team during a manual recount.

2. In a partisan race that is the subject of a recount, each political party with a candidate whose ultimate success or failure in the race could be adversely or favorably impacted by the recount is entitled to have:

- a. One representative for the canvassing board.
- b. One additional representative per counting team during a manual recount.

(e) Names of representatives to be provided.

The persons or entities entitled to have representatives present during a recount must provide the names of their designated representatives in writing as soon as is practicable under the circumstances to the Supervisors of Election or the municipal clerk, whichever is applicable, before the recount begins. Failure to provide the names of their representatives shall negate the opportunity of the persons or entity to have the representative present during the recount, except on the same conditions as a member of the public.

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
